COST FOR COMPETITORS

\$2,467.00

All competitors will be placed in a double occupancy room and will share the room with another competitor.

COST FOR ADVISORS/DELEGATES

Single Occupancy - \$3,085.00

Based on request, Advisors and Delegates will be placed in a single occupancy room.

Double Occupancy - \$2,614.00

Based on request, Advisors and Delegates will be placed in a shared room, double occupancy.

Please note that all trip fees include the following:

- Airfare to Toronto/Quebec City/Winnipeg, with one checked bag and one carry-on and one personal item each way. Does not include the cost of transporting extra luggage or contest tools or equipment.
- Bus transfers to and from Quebec City airport.
- Quebec City Hotel room nights.
- Skills competition event registration fees.
- Team breakfast meeting and some meals while in Quebec City. Please take note that not all meals will be provided. Refer to the meal planning notes on page 10.

AIR FLIGHTS

Please note: Team Manitoba is flying to Quebec City using two different providers Westjet and Air Canada.

All passengers are required to be at the airport 1.5-2 hours prior to departure. Note that the flight departure times may change closer to the travel date.

**Please Note: Once we land in Toronto Pearson Airport, we will be in Terminal 3. We need to get to Terminal 1 to board Air Canada for Quebec City.*

Proceed to get your luggage. Once the luggage is collected, we exit into the Arrivals area of the airport. Walk to Door D. Then take the elevator to the third floor.

We will get on the Link Train (We may need several to accommodate our group of 95) which will take us to Terminal 1. It takes about 5 minutes.

Once we enter the Airport at Terminal 1, we will proceed to check into our Air Canada Flight with our luggage, enroute to Quebec City.

We will try our best to stay together, However, if someone gets separated you know you will need to make your way to the Air Canada Check-in Counter in Terminal 1 to check in for the Quebec Flight.

All airline tickets will be in electronic format and emailed out prior to the event. Please ensure that you have a copy of your e-ticket available to check-in at the airports.

A form of Identification is required and must be a government issued picture identification to board the flights. Examples: Passport, Driver's license, etc.

Please note that your Legal name must match on all identification and airline tickets issued.

Illness or Medical Emergencies During Travel

Please note that Skills Manitoba will not be responsible for any expenses (medical, incidentals or quarantine related expenses) that may occur while traveling. We encourage all competitors and delegates to have appropriate medical insurance while traveling.

LUGGAGE

All Competitors, Advisors, and/or Delegates are responsible for any costs transporting your required tools or contest items. Please ensure each piece of your checked and carry-on luggage has an identification tag with your name and address on it.

We suggest reviewing Westjet and Air Canada's baggage details to ensure that your luggage, tools or contest items meet their standards and safety regulations. (Ex, power tools, batteries, liquids, etc.)

Your airline tickets include one (1) checked piece of luggage not exceeding 50lbs, one (1) carry-on, and a personal item. If you have any additional luggage or items, there will be extra fees.

To help you avoid any additional fees, we recommend that you pack your lightweight tools or contest items into your regular luggage. It's important to note that your checked luggage should not go over the allowed weight limit of 50lbs.

When prepping toolboxes/contest items, all must have the provided toolbox labels attached before it arrives at the Centre De Foires in Quebec City.

Large Toolboxes or contest items that can not be part of your regular luggage pieces are considered to be extra or oversized and must be sent ahead of time to Quebec City, Centre De Foires on May 27 or May 28 only or to the Team's hotel in advance.

REQUIRED CONTEST ITEMS AND TOOLBOX INFORMATION

It is important for each competitor to check online for contest details, such as scope of project, tool listing/supplies needed, safety equipment and any other contest item requirements. Please check the site regularly to review any changes to your contest requirements.

Upon arrival in Quebec City, we will stop at the Centre de Foires to pick up our event team registration packages/passes. It is recommended that all large tool/contest items be brought off the chartered bus if they haven't been pre-shipped already. Smaller tools/contest items (computers, small tools, etc.) can be brought to the contest areas at orientation. If tools/contest items are not being dropped off until the orientation, competitors are responsible to get the items to the Centre de Foires. Please take a picture of the items with the toolbox label on it just in case it gets misplaced.

Provided competition labels need to be used and affixed to items to identify competitor's name, contest name, contest number and province. Please see attached template to use with contest number listing for reference when filling out the label.

Project Pick-up after SCNC

Projects in the following Skill Areas will be available for pick up by competitors prior to the closing ceremony. Any projects left after the pick-up deadline will be disposed of by SCC.

- Precision Machining
- CNC Machining
- Welding
- Hairdressing
- Fashion Technology
- Cabinetmaking
- Sheet Metal

The competitors are responsible for ensuring that their project is properly labelled. Competitors are to ask the NTC for the appropriate label and fill it out to affix to the project. Pick up location: Lobby of the Competition Halls A & B.

Note that any costs associated with shipping these items back home are your responsibility.

HOTEL ACCOMMODATIONS – Hotel Classique

Team Manitoba will be staying at Hotel Classique.

Team Manitoba competitors will be assigned shared rooms with another competitor of the same gender. Delegates/Advisors will be placed in double or single occupancy rooms based on availability. We will make every effort to accommodate special requests. We suggest that advisors or chaperones bring a copy of their rooming list once provided by us so that they can easily keep track of who their team members are rooming with. Breakfast is included with the rooms for each day of our stay.

Upon arrival at the hotel, Skills Manitoba will distribute the room keys.

TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM AIRPORT IN QUEBEC CITY

Transportation to and from Quebec City Airport will be provide by Skills Manitoba.

Arrival Day – Tuesday, May 28, 2024

Upon arrival at airport, Autocar Excellence will pick up and transport the team to Centre de Foires where we will be required to stop at to pick up event registration packages/passes and drop off any toolbox/contest items that you may have. From there we will be taken to Hotel Classique.

Departure Day– Sunday, June 2, 2024

Autocar Excellence will pick up Team Manitoba (with all luggage and toolboxes/contest items) at the Hotel Classique at approximately 3:30 am and transport the team to the airport.
